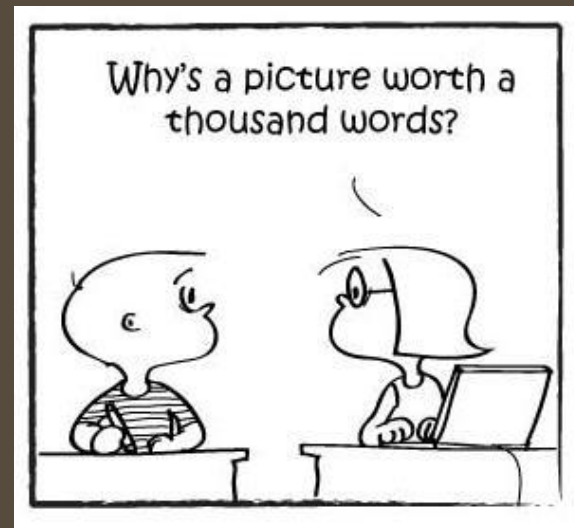

# WHAT IS A POLITICAL CARTOON?

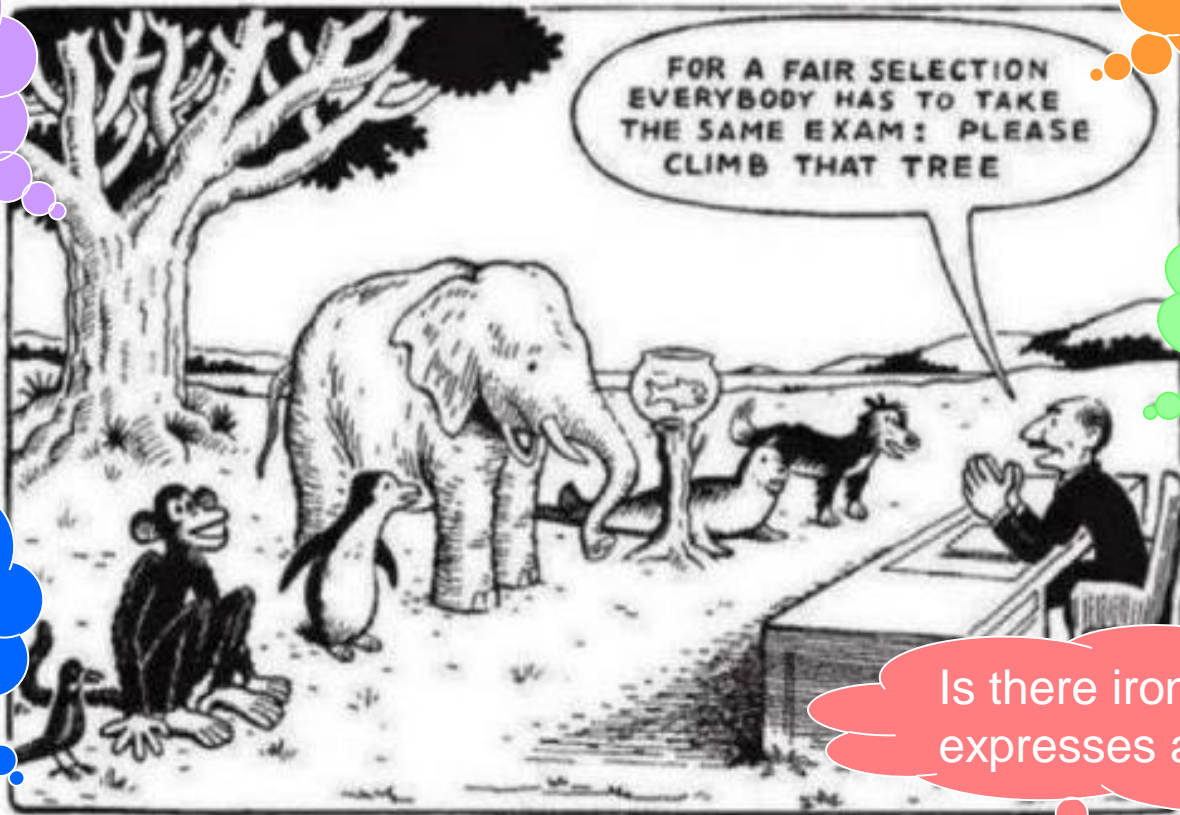
- \*A **political cartoon** is a **cartoon** that has a message about a **political** issue or event.
- \*Express viewpoints (bias) on political, economic, or social issues
- \*Make use of humor, exaggeration, irony, symbolism, historical events, and stereotypes.

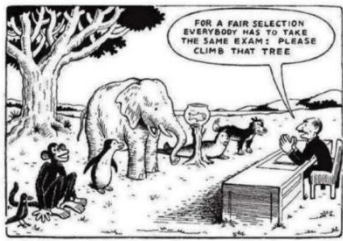

# “Our Education System”

The exaggeration is....

Animals taking an exam, seal is away from water, where would a penguin and a elephant be in the same location?, and a teacher sitting in a desk in the forest.

The analogy is.....

The elephant would not need to even climb the tree to reach the top, the bird could fly, the monkey is an amazing tree climber, the penguin and the seal have probably never even been this close to a tree, the dog could give tree climbing a go, and there is no way the fish could even get out of the bowl. If you judge a fish by its ability to climb a tree, it will live its whole life believing he is stupid.

The labels are....

Picture is labeled “education system”

The symbolism is..

The teacher’s desk is symbolic of a traditional classroom, the tree is symbolic of one size fits all exams, and the animals are symbolic of the students with different learning styles and abilities.

Setting?



The exaggeration is....

- No one during this time is literally squeezing the workers

The analogy is.....

- By showing the worker being squeezed by the owner, this is an analogy for how the worker is being taken advantage of.

The irony is.....

- The worker should benefit from his hard work.

The labels are....

- The vice is labeled “Low Wages”, and “High Rent”, the owner is labeled “Pullman”

The symbolism is..

- The owner is fat to show greed and wealth. The worker is a symbol for all workers at this time. The vice is a symbol for all the things oppressing the workers.
